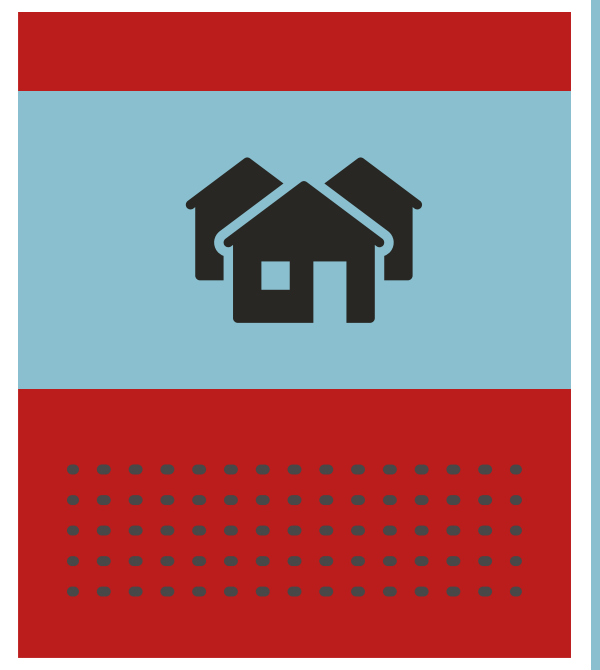
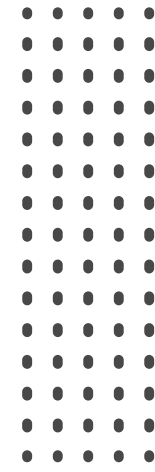

# WHAT IS A CONSOLIDATED PLAN?



- A 5-year strategic plan **required** by HUD for cities receiving federal formula grants
- Guides how Baton Rouge invests in housing, infrastructure, and community development
- Guides programs intended to improve the lives of low income persons in Baton Rouge
- Informed by **data, community input, and local priorities**

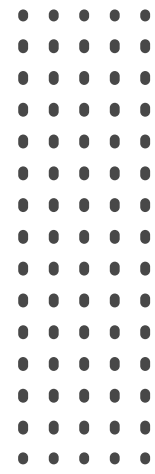

# HUD GRANTS BATON ROUGE RECEIVES

- 1. Community Development Block Grant (CDBG):** Supports housing rehab, public infrastructure, blight removal, and services for low-income residents
- 2. HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME):** Funds affordable housing construction, rental assistance, and homebuyer support
- 3. Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG):** Assists individuals and families experiencing or at risk of homelessness
- 4. Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA):** Provides housing and supportive services for low-income people living with HIV/AIDS

- **Annual Action Plans:** Detail specific projects and use of funds each year

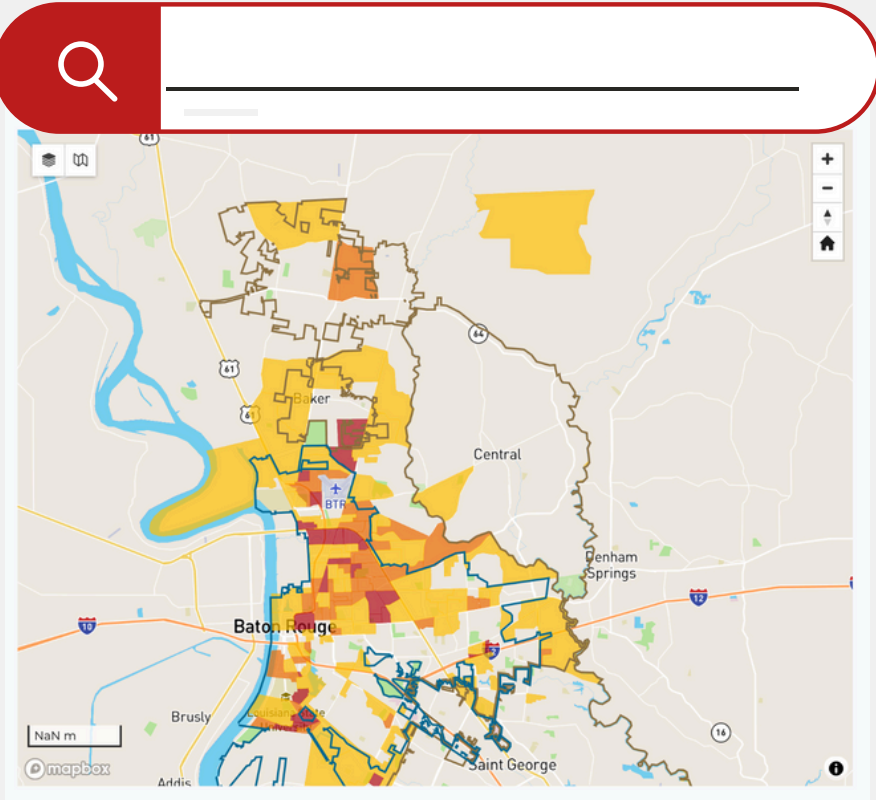
# WHAT IS CONSIDERED LOW INCOME IN BATON ROUGE?

2024 Median Household Income in the Baton Rouge Metro area is **\$87,400** based on a family of 4 persons.

Low-income is defined as families making 80% or less than the median income
